Reader Sunday and Readers' Annual Service

On 4th September, the Diocese of York is marking Reader Sunday – an opportunity to give thanks for the work done by Readers in churches, chaplaincies and communities across the Diocese, and an opportunity to encourage others to perhaps consider whether it is a ministry to which they might be called. Usually, Readers are invited to preach at services on Reader Sunday, but our two Readers in the Benefice will be on holiday on that date(!) However, if you would like to know more about what a Reader does, you can speak to Steve or Tricia any time.

And each year, a special service is held at York Minster when all new Readers being licensed to the Diocese of York are admitted to office, and all serving Readers are invited to reaffirm the vows they made when they were licensed. This year the service is being held on Saturday 24th September at 10.30am.

Although Readers and their incumbents are strongly encouraged to attend (Steve, Tricia & Paulie will all be there!), the service is open to anyone in the congregations served by Readers to come along and show their support. No need to book a space – just turn up. The service is scheduled to last about an hour.

Come and explore this wonderful 12th c. Norman church with its Roman tombstone, Saxon crosses and mediaeval treasures, including a 15th century window of international significance. The church lies on the edge of the parkland of the Grimston Park Estate.

The church has a Norman door and arches in the nave and a Norman font. Inside there are some well preserved Anglo Saxon crosses (c.890) and a Roman memorial slab (from the Forum in Rome) brought to the church in the 19th century.

The stained glass windows are particularly fine and include an Austrian window (c.1420), and another with 15th and 16th c. decorative panels of Flemish and German glass. When the church was restored in 1861 by the patron Lord Londesborough, he provided the two east windows by Capronnier of Brussels. To the right of the altar is a modern window of 1980.

To the left of the altar is a 16th c. carved wooden screen with panels containing domestic scenes of cooking, playing cards and shooting a bird. A brass floor memorial of a priest dated 1479.
